COUNTABLE NOUNS

1. Use **a** or **an** with an unspecified singular count noun. (A singular count noun is one person, place, or thing). Use **an** before a word that begins with a vowel or a vowel sound.

NO: I honest man.

NO: The woman asked for exact count.

YES: The woman asked for *an* exact count.

2. Use *the* with *specific* singular and plural count nouns. (Plural count nouns are 2 or more person, places, or things.)

S pecific singular count noun:

NO: Puppy I saw in park was black and white.

YES: *The* puppy I saw in *the* park was black and white.

S pecific plural count noun:

 $NO: E \ ngineers \ from \ C \ learwater \ C \ ompany \ designed \ a \ new \ system$ for water purification.

YES: \emph{The} engineers from C learwater C ompany designed a new system for water purification.

3. Do not use the with plural count nouns used in the general sense.

NO: *The* astronauts go through training programs to prepare for space flight.

 $\label{eq:YES:Astronauts} YES: A stronauts go through training programs to prepare for space flight.$
